NOMINATION DEADLINE:

Fall/Winter Semester - **April 30**th Spring/Summer Semester - **September 30**th

Prior to nomination, students must complete at least one year of study at their home institution (bachelor's level). The international office of the sending institution must submit the nomination letter on behalf of the exchange student to start the process.

Bachelor and Master (BA/BS and MA/MSc/MBA)

All courses are open to exchange students, but they must meet the required pre-requisites as outlined in the course descriptions. Some courses may require a selection process, a preliminary approval will be conducted by the MTA international office.

Hebrew is the primary language of instruction. However, all courses specified indicated for student exchange will be delivered in English.

Incoming exchange students must be able to understand and produce academic work at an English level of B2 on the Common European Framework (CEF). Further information on CEF can be found <u>here:</u>

ORIENTATION PROGRAM

The International Office will hold a weeklong orientation program prior to the start of the semester. Attendance is mandatory for all incoming students.

VISA

All international students planning to study at MTA must obtain a multiple-entry A/2 student visa through an Israeli embassy or consulate prior to arrival in Israel. It is your responsibility to contact your nearest Israeli embassy or consulate and apply for the relevant visa in advance of your departure. Only an Israeli embassy or consulate can issue this visa, and MTA is not involved in this process.

Recommendations:

You should start the process at least six weeks prior to your departure for Israel. Processing times and procedures vary from embassy/consulate to embassy/consulate. Please contact your nearest Israeli embassy or consulate to get information on how to apply for a visa and what visa application documents you will need to submit.

In most cases, an acceptance letter to the program is the only documentation that you will need from MTA. If the Israeli embassy or consulate requires further documentation from MTA, please be in touch with the Program Coordinator, Mrs. Deena Mesika at <u>international@mta.ac.il</u>

Before arrival, exchange students must submit a copy of their health insurance that states it includes medical, accidental, and Covid-19 coverage.



HOUSING	Exchange students will be responsible to find and to finance their living accommodations. Every reasonable effort will be made to assist in to find living accommodations either on-campus or off-campus close by.
STUDENT UNION & BUDDY PROGRAM	The Student Union at MTA has many functions at the college including student advocacy, organizing activities, and offering student services.
	Buddy Program - An optional choice, participants will be paired with an MTA student for the duration of the semester, in the hopes of helping with the acclimation process and to be a resource for the visiting student.
ACCESSIBILITY	MTA makes it possible for students and staff with either physical or learning disabilities as well as chronic illnesses to participate in courses, exams, and college life autonomously with equal rights.
	All MTA buildings are wheelchair accessible, both from the outside and inside (lecture halls, seminar rooms, computer labs, cafeteria, and the library).
TRANSPORTATION	We recommend downloading the mobile app "Moovit" prior your arrival. Moovit will give you real time travel instructions on how to reach your destination.
